We want to open by thanking each and every one of you who has been praying a little more and giving a little (or a lot!) extra in response to our last update and request. We have felt so much love and support, and we are so grateful.

Not many weeks after that last update we began hearing rumors of a possible revolution in Haiti, so we knew if we were going to come out to the U.S. at all this year it would have to be immediately. God was in every step of the process to make our transition smooth...getting airline tickets and Covid tests, preparing (ourselves and everyone else) for our absence, and the actual travel. Only days after our arrival in Tampa, where we planned to stay with Ashley while we self-quarantined, the president of Haiti was brutally assassinated. We, and the entire country, spent a week reeling from that shock while investigations were conducted. Very few details have yet been released, but very surprisingly the climate of Haiti has been somewhat calm since. We are now in the Midwest for a time. Travel to and from Haiti remains uncertain, and though we desire to return as soon as God opens the door we do not have any idea when that will be. Please pray for us to wait patiently and with peace in God's perfect timing, as we are concerned and feel responsible for our people there on the ground.

Thank you for your prayers for Joselyn, who was shot in the stomach when caught in crossfire earlier this summer. He has been released from the hospital, but still has the colostomy bag. He is staying on our property where Monique (Marc's wife, a nurse) and others can care for him. Please pray for his continued and complete healing and that the colostomy bag would only be temporary, as he is more likely to get an infection with it.

Wilckly was encouraged by a short trip to the DR to visit a few of the girls we raised in the children's home: Mirline and Tika and their kids, but then we received word that another girl we raised, Danita, who had been ill had passed away. Helping out with another funeral from a distance has been difficult...and it is hard to express how hard it is to lose someone so young, who was a daughter to you. This is the third of our children from the home that we have lost in the past eleven years. Please pray for healing and comfort for our hearts and for all the others who were influential in the kids' lives in the children's home.
