### Dearest Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are excited to tell you about the things that are happening in Haiti! School continues to function despite the situation. You have continued to help us so that we are able to pay our teachers their salary.

Thank you so much for that. Remember that the school is where we have the opportunity to teach the Bible as part of the curriculum and introduce the kids to Jesus. We praise God that our director has been able to keep the school running in our absence. Our churches continue meeting, encouraging one another and preaching the word. Activities continue such as Sunday School, Bible study, baptisms, weddings and funerals. We recently lost Bioude who was very important to our ministry and Pasteur Jilmiste, one of our faithful pastors.

We continue working on Wilckly's U.S. residency which will make it much easier for him to travel freely to Haiti, the Dominican Republic or anywhere else he would decide to go. We have never been in the States long enough for him to work on it before. The bad thing is that he cannot travel out of the country while it is processing until he is given a special travel document which would be valid for one year. It could take three to four months to get this. Please pray for us that this would be processed quickly. He is very anxious to get on the ground in the Dominican Republic.

Wilckly is a visionary. He has never stopped dreaming and visualizing for Haiti even in her darkest hour but now he is dreaming and visualizing for the Dominican Republic as well. Imagine that we left Haiti knowing we would be back soon and then that didn't happen. The Dominican Republic has opened the door for ministry to continue with Haitians there and Dominicans. It has given us hope.

We will continue to support our people and ministries in Haiti. We appreciate you standing behind us so that we can do just that. However, things have not started to look up yet in Haiti. We continue to pray that this will change but, in the meantime, we are unable to return safely. The kids are in school here in Bedford, Iowa. We are praying God will open the doors, provide the travel documents and funds for travel to the Dominican Republic this summer. If you would like to help with that specifically, we still need \$2,000 to send in with his birth certificate and a few other final documents. It is a LOT of paperwork.

Praise the Lord! You have made it possible for us to make a down payment on the land we are purchasing in the Dominican Republic. The balance of \$40,000 US remains to be paid. We ask you to prayerfully consider how you might be able to contribute to this, however small or large the donation, it will be appreciated. Maybe your family, Bible study group, small group or church would like to help in some way. This land will mean we have our own space to develop the ministry to the Haitian and Dominican people. The summer visit will be helpful as we continue to pray and ask God what He would have us to do there. Being on the ground will help us better understand what the needs are, and we will go from there.

Please pray for Wilckly to be strengthened and encouraged, as he receives several phone calls everyday from Haiti and the Dominican with needs and challenges of the ministry. He continues to mentor, teach and lead from right here in Bedford. Pray that the weather continues to warm up and he can at least step outside and get some air. We praise you and thank you for being such faithful partners with us and carrying us through these challenging times of change. May God bless you all.
