She saw this flannelgraph set on our wish list. Then they found this set in their storage that had never been used! Instead, it had been sitting in storage just waiting for such a time as this to be used in our ministry in the Dominican Republic. Val and I had the chance to meet up so I could get it from her and reminisced about a time

during college when we spent two months in Puerto Rico together helping various missionaries. One of our tasks there was to cut out a small set of this same Betty Lukens flannel graph!

Arriving home with the set I knew there was no way that I would ever get them cut out on my own. We organized "Dee's Cutting Up Party" where ladies came from Blockton Christian Church, New Market Church of Christ, United Christian Presbyterian Church and First Baptist Church of Bedford to cut out all the flannel-graph figures. It was a fun day of fellowship, and they finished the job in no time. I was able to put it all in my suitcase and pay extra to be able to carry the huge backdrops to frame the stories. Arriving in the Dominican Republic,



it took Christella and I three days to get all the figures placed in the special filing system. We had flannel graph everywhere but finally everything found a spot. All that to say a huge shout out and THANK YOU!!!! to all of those who made this possible! It is an amazing teaching tool, and I was able to teach the first Sunday School lesson with it and it was a definite hit with the kids and adults alike.

It takes a lot to orchestrate a trip: timing and money being paramount. I was so anxious to make this trip. I planned to go on Sept. 2nd and return Sept. 11th. The next day a friend stopped by with a check for \$200 to help us get to the Dominican Republic. I looked up tickets for Sept. 10th and returning Sept. 18th and guess what? They were no longer \$600 but \$400!!! I was so excited! God had provided \$800, enough to purchase both round trip tickets. His timing is always best.

I was able to spend a week there and Wilckly stayed to continue working and building the ministry on the ground in the Dominican Republic. We continue to work and support everything that we had to leave behind in Haiti. Those people in the churches in Haiti have not lost hope. They continue to thrive and work until Jesus returns. The persecution from the gangs is unbearable and makes daily living very difficult. It's because of your faithful support that we can continue to be a lifeline to all of those left behind. We've been able to help provide food, shelter and life-saving surgery, just to name a few, and all
